Introduction	At the McKee it is our intention to be a fully inclusive school which does not allow the cost of participation to be a barrier to student engagement.
	We will therefore strive to ensure that all activities undertaken and provision offered will be free at the point of use for all our students, regardless of income.
	This is because we recognise that all our learners are vulnerable and that the activities we arrange and run are designed to support these vulnerable learners in developing confidence and resilience.
The Aim of this policy	To clarify the McKees position on charging and remissions.
The Objective of this policy	To ensure all parents, carers and students recognise and understand that we will not charge students for participating in any of our organised school events such as sporting fixtures or school trips in normal circumstances.
	We will also not charge students for taking part in lessons such as cookery or textiles or any other subject which has material costs.
	We will not charge students for additional study materials such as revision guides, unless they are replacements. A returnable deposit may be required for some materials.
	Voluntary Contributions
	In some extraordinary circumstances it may be it is not possible to make these additional activities within the resources ordinarily available to the school, the school may request or invite parents to make a contribution towards the cost of the trip or activity.
	Pupils will not be treated differently according to whether or not their parents have made any contribution in response to the request or invitation. However, where there are not enough voluntary contributions to make the activity possible, then it will not take place.
